It is with a profound sense of loss today that we share news of the death of Natalie Pascus. Natalie began her career in Port Hardy in 1987 and migrated to Parksville, where she worked for over 30 years.

Natalie enjoyed life and was always giving to others. She was kind-hearted and would always hide candy or treats in the ambulance for crews to find in the middle of the shift. She was a giving person and had recently passed the final medical hurdle to donate a kidney to a person she did not even know. Natalie was very loyal to her station and her community and although in shock, her colleagues continue to ensure their patients and the Oceanside community is well served in her memory and out of respect for her. Natalie had a profound impact on those who knew her.

With Natalie's passing, her family, friends, brothers and sisters within APBC and BCEHS feel a sense of loss. Some consolation can come in the form of fond memories that some of us have been fortunate enough to have shared with a truly remarkable individual. Natalie would want those who knew her to reminisce about the good times.

At this time, we are focused on supporting the Parksville Station, each other and Natalie's family. Once a decision is made or as details become available with respect to any service or memorial become we will keep you updated.
