P.A.R.T.Y Program

P.A.R.T.Y. (Prevent Alcohol and Risk-Related Trauma in Youth) is an injury prevention program designed for high school students. Each year, over 3500 Grade 10 students from across Vancouver Island visit hospitals to learn about trauma and the consequences of risky behavior.

P.A.R.T.Y. is run entirely by volunteers! Professional volunteers such as BC paramedics are the heart of the program. We are grateful for the continued support of the many paramedics throughout Vancouver Island who give their time for a few hours every month to share our important injury prevention message. We are always looking for more volunteers. This is a great way to prevent traumatic injury in youth in your community while gaining CME credits!
